Per Section 1003.4156, Florida Statutes (F.S.), for students to meet middle grades promotion requirements, a Career and Education Planning course must be completed. At a minimum, the course must be Internet-based, customizable to each student and include researched-based **assessments** to assist students in determining educational and career options and goals. (2019)

Discover your interests

- All 8th grade students **MUST** complete and submit their Education Plan.
- This is a Promotion Requirement



8th grade World History teachers will guide students through an exploration of the career modules found in **My Career Shines**, the online format approved by the Florida Department of Education for students to use to explore careers and create a career plan.

*2 interests inventory completed in Social Studies

***1 Career Plan mandatory for Graduation**

Middle School **Counselors** will assist students create their **Education Plans**.

Counselors must approve the 8th grade Education Plans by March 31, 2022

High School courses in Middle School count towards High School GPA and may impact college admission.

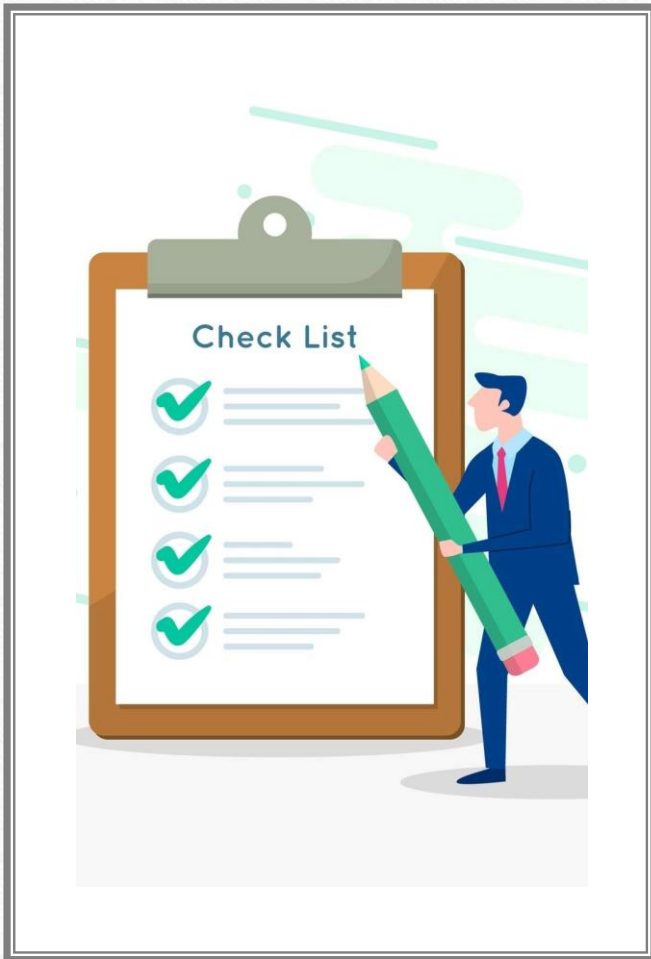

Highschool assignments are based on **address on file**

- If you have a change of address, your parent must come in the main office with proof of address so that the change of address can be made. Address updates should be submitted to school office ASAP.
- This change of address also applies to changes that need to be made in the emergency contact card.
- Even if you apply to a magnet high school, you need the right address on file and to complete a subject selection for your home school.
- **NO SEPARATE APPLICATION** is needed for neighborhood school
- MAGNET schools - An online application **IS** required . Application deadline- **January 15th**. Apply for up to **5** schools at www.yourchoicemiami.org
- PRIVATE or CHARTER school-Admission requirements and application deadlines vary by school

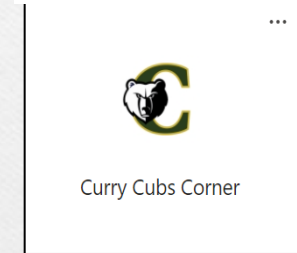

What are Academies?¶

Academies are small learning communities within a school that draw on the interests of students in career-related subjects. Academies prepare students for post-secondary education and careers through academic learning and hands-on work experiences within a theme-based, contextualized curriculum. Students are exposed to broad career opportunities in the work force so that they can make sound choices for the future. Each academy is connected to interested employers in the community who provide the school with technical support, advisory board members, speakers, field trip hosts, mentors, and internships.¶

What are Magnet Programs?¶

Magnet is a designation for students who live outside of Ferguson's attendance boundaries. Magnet academies have a limited number of seats available for these students. Students must apply through the District's magnet application process.¶

What are Choice Programs?¶

Choice is a designation for students who live outside of Ferguson's attendance boundaries. Choice programs have a limited number of seats available for these students. Students must apply using a Choice transfer application.¶
